





very time I visit Hoi An I feel as though I am coming home. And my second home there is the Hoi An Hotel, beautifully located in the heart of the ancient town. I usually walk slowly around the spacious garden, listening to birds singing and enjoying the delicate aroma of flowers. At those moments it's like returning to my childhood.

The two-storey hotel is built in the style of an old Hoi An house, with all rooms elegantly designed in a traditional décor of dark wood furnishings, white crown mouldings, stylish lighting fixtures, and muted colour schemes, which reflect the atmosphere and beauty of ancient Hoi An town. Each guestroom has a private front balcony and a spectacular view of the garden.

The hotel offers use of a well-equipped fitness centre, where I do light exercises in the morning before going to the outdoor pool for a swim. The late afternoon is an exciting time to relax by the pool, enjoying a cocktail to the melodies of music filling the air.

The hotel offers interesting experiences in flavours. The oaks Terrace Restaurant brings a contemporary European brassiere style to Hoi An as an all-dining venue set among oak trees. It serves an international a-la-carte menu for lunch and dinner as well as theme parties. Indochine Corner Restaurant, meanwhile, features a traditional Asian interior with open air, indoor seating where guests can enjoy traditional Vietnamese and other Asian dishes. One of the most popular activities for guests is the cooking class, which presents a chance to visit Hoi An's colourful market and experience its amazing sights, sound and aromas. And I also took a bike

tour to visit Tra Que vegetable village, where I saw local farmers working in their fields and enjoyed delicious banh xeo (fried rice pancake) with aromatic vegetables.

After dinner I went for a walk around the ancient town to see the nightlife. Hoi An had a nostalgic feel under the light of lanterns, with its ancient houses and moss-covered walls. Its narrow mall streets were full of tourists but I still had a sense of peace.
